# **ANZAC Day in Panmure**

The Panmure/Mt Wellington RSA are in the final planning stages of what should prove to be a memorable ANZAC Day event.

The plan is to start ANZAC day with a Veterans Breakfast (by invitation only) at 8.00am. The annual ANZAC Parade will step off at 9.30am from outside the RSA Club rooms in Queens Road and proceed down the street to the Panmure Community Hall in Pilkington Road. The Remembrance Service begins at 10.00am and upon its completion the ANZAC Parade will return to the RSA for the flag raising ceremony and the Last Post.

For all those attending the Parade there will be a FREE lunch and a beverage of their choice.

Lunch will be followed by entertainment from the Ruoptaka Kapa Haka Group and a Brass Band playing classic hits from the past. During this time a Magician will be entertaining the crowds.

The evening will wind up with a live band and dancing. On display outside the RSA will be two fully restored WWII jeeps and a Bren Gun half track carrier (pictured below)

We have been very fortunate that Danielle Carter who has filled in for Julie in the past was available to step into the role and is happy to work for us as long as we need her. Lisa and I visited Julie in hospital and we are very pleased that she is now home.

I was one of 50 people being interviewed by the Auditor General in regards to my perspective on how the AMETI Project had progressed, how the AMETI team had communicated with us and dealt with any problems affecting the PBA businesses. A report will be collated from all the interviews and the results of the audit will be presented to parliament as part of the government ensuring the money spent on the AMETI Project has been spent well.

Over the past month I attended two Auckland Council's 'Help Shape the future of Auckland' meetings in preparation for the PBA submission to the Auckland Councils Long Term Plan and The 10 Year Budget 2015 – 2025. The focus of the submission was in relation to the Maungakiekie-Tāmaki Local Board Plan and I was given the opportunity to discuss the PBA submission with the Local Board last week.

Two days later, the PBA Chair, Leon Matthews and I spoke to the Local Board again but this time we were there to report on the PBA's achievements over the past year, such as the completion of our \$214,000.00 CCTV installation project. We also outlined the plans for this year which will include strategic planning work, greater use of the Cross Queens Road Rigging and refreshing and streamlining the Tastes of Panmure Promotion and our Cluster Advertising.

#### Lisa's connection to ANZAC Day

On Thursday 19 March I met with Wendy Petrie from TV One News to do a short interview about my Grandfather, Arthur Perry, who fought in Gallipoli. The filming was done at the Auckland Museum. I took along boxes of memorabilia that have been passed down the family line since 1914.

Monday last week I did a similar talk to 100 St Thomas' Primary School children. Likewise next month I will be doing the same for Otahuhu College and Panmure Bridge School.


My Grandfather Arthur, at the age of 22 was called in to Active Service.

He landed in ANZAC Cove on 25th April 1914 five hours after the initial landing. In his kit bag Granddad took with him a Kodak A1 folding camera.

On his return to Dunedin he processed the film and had an album made which he them annotated. This annotation made the album even more special as it gives us accurate people and place names. Arthur returned to New Zealand on the hospital ship Maheno after contacting typhoid when he became stranded in 'no mans land' for 2 days.

Along with his passes, call up sheets, orders and other memorabilia we have Grandad's Gold Watch. This also holds a wartime story. In 1913 Arthur was awarded a Gold Watch for his skills at Roller Skating at a Dunedin rink. This was engraved with his first initials, surname and date. This treasures item he then took to Gallipoli. Whilst bathing in ANZAC Cove one day in May 2015, Arthur return to his kit to find his watch missing. The story does not end here. Some ten years later he receives a phone call from the Police. A young girl had been approached by an unsavory gentleman in New Plymouth, having fended him off with a pickaxe handle and some pepper to the face he runs off dropping the Gold Watch whilst in flight. Granddad, now living in Dunedin in reunited with his beloved watch. This watch is now a family treasure.

There are many more stories from Arthur's life which th family enjoyed sharing. He was such a kind, happy and friendly man it is hard to imagine how he could have coped with war. Granddad loved children and also especially loved to potter about in his immaculately kept garden. Widowed in his mid 70's Arthur rekindled his friendship with Roey whom he had dated prior to going to war. In his 81st year he was kissing her under every second tree along the streets of Arrowtown intending to kiss her under the others on the way back. Alas he died of a stroke in an instance before he could. Lisa Perry

Kate is from Katikati and travels throughout New Zealand educating families on how to save money by reducing waste.


